Investment in Culbokie, Ross and Cromarty

Welcome to the latest newsletter about our water main improvement project in your area. This essential work will help ensure a continued supply of clear, fresh drinking water and reduce the risk of burst pipes.

We are pleased to let you know that as of the end of May work is complete in Balnabeen and Knockbain areas, and nearing completion in the Milton/Findon area.

The next phase of the project will take place in the centre of Culbokie, along the main street (B9169) from Schoolcroft to Findon Hall, including work within Schoolcroft itself where we'll be installing a new water main.

Works also continue in Easter Kinkell to Culbo.



Road closures will continue from the B9169 at Culbokie Hall to the B9163 at Findon until July 2025. Local access will be maintained.

Going forward

B9169 Raven Croft to Church Centre

Temporary traffic lights in place from 16th June for approx. 15 weeks.

Easter Kinkell

Temporary traffic lights on the B9169 from Knocknafanaig Road junction to Wellhouse junction from 7th July for approx. 6 weeks.

Schoolcroft

Road closure from 8th July for approx. 12 weeks.

Diversion routes will be clearly signposted with local access maintained during the above traffic management in the area.



Next steps

We are in the process of arranging a drop-in session for affected residents, business owners, and locals who are interested in the project. Once a final location is confirmed we will communicate the details to all.
