Specific Comments

Scottish Water, in agreement with the Scottish Government and SEPA, has developed a Route Map for Improving Urban Waters, which will sit alongside our River Basin Management Plan (RBMP) 3rd Cycle commitments. The Route Map was published in December 2021 and as such we are committed to reviewing and updating our deliverables currently set out in the Marine Litter Strategy (MLS) consultation document.

We are working to improve screening, monitoring of Combined Sewer Overflow (CSO) spill events and developing solutions to reduce release of sewage related debris (SRD) from the sewerage network.

We strongly believe that the best way to control SRD is through source control. We have developed a new customer awareness campaign, Nature Calls, that urges Scotland's people to only flush the 3Ps (pee, poo & toilet paper), bin the wipes and support a ban on all wet wipes that contain plastic.

We consider that campaigns alone cannot be successful in tackling marine litter in the long term. We are committed to working with stakeholders to remove unnecessary plastic from the products which are likely to become SRD, such as wet wipes containing plastic, plastic tampon applicators and plastic tobacco filters.

We are working with national and international stakeholders to influence policy and to improve labelling of products e.g., Water UK and Eureau.

We would welcome an action on Zero Waste Scotland (ZWS) preparing businesses for future changes in legislation such as The Environmental Protection (Single-use Plastic Products) (Scotland) Regulations 2021, so they can make the appropriate informed changes to reduce problematic and commonly littered plastics.

The consultation states that the first review will be held in 2024-25 and the second in 2027, we would ask whether it has been considered that 3 review periods are considered to match the short, medium and long-term timescale of the deliverables?

Yes, Scottish Water recently published a Route Map for Improving Urban Waters, which will sit alongside the River Basin Management Plan (RBMP) 3rd Cycle, we will work with Marine Scotland to update Strategic Direction 2.

In addition, we wish to highlight that an estimated 120 tonnes of tobacco waste are discarded in the UK every day, costing millions to clear up. When littered, tobacco filters may be washed into drains, entering the surface water system and marine environment.

Tobacco filters contain plastic in the form of cellulose acetate which can take up to 12 years to break down. Research shows that they can be made of pure cellulose instead, which breaks down in a matter of weeks. We would therefore support a ban on tobacco filters containing plastic as well as action on reducing littering of these products.

We would also recommend consideration be given to the emerging issue of vaping litter.
